
Section 2: Determining Boundaries

If you are new to an area or your child is just entering the school system, you may be unsure of which school they are supposed to attend. The steps below will help you determine which


school district your family lives in and the schools that are assigned to those boundaries. Once you have determined your boundaries, you can decide if you want to enroll your child at their "home" school or get a permit for them to attend a school outside of those boundaries. Find your school district:

- 1. Go to: https://nces.ed.gov/ccd/districtsearch/
- 2. Click on the words "School & District Navigator"




3. On the "Let's get started tab click on the left green button labeled "Districts"



4. In the search bar, type in your home address and press the search button. (The search button is marked with a magnifying glass



5. A box should appear on the right identifying which school district you live in.




Sometimes, the website may pull up more than one eligible district, if this happens going to the potential districts websites and utilizing their school search tools is the best option.


Finding your school

In order to find out which school boundaries you live in open any internet browser and go to:

https://jordandistrict.org/




Move your cursor over to where it says "Parents and Students"; this will bring down a drop down menu.




Click where it says "Boundaries and Bus Stops".



After clicking on this section, your screen should look similar to this.




From here you will want to scroll down until you reach the spot labeled "Bus Stop and Address Query". From there you should click where it says "Find your School Boundary and Bus Stop". This is highlighted in yellow in the picture below.




After clicking there, you should be greeted with this screen. From this screen you can narrow the scope of your search by grade, which will simplify the results if you only have one child attending school. However, if you have multiple children who will be attending different grades it is best to leave it set to search for all grades.



From there enter your street address, there is no need to include the zip code. After you have entered your address click go.




If your address is within the District's boundaries a table will come up with the school boundaries you live in.



The first column (left) identifies by name which school boundaries you live in. It lists the middle school first, then the high school, and concludes with the elementary school. The middle column lets you know if you are eligible to use the school bus as a means of transportation. The third column (the rightmost column) lists which grades each school serves.

If any of the school's names are blue, it means that you are eligible to use the bus system. If you click on the school's name a table will show up listing nearby bus stops, the time the bus arrives there and what days of the week the bus stops there.




To help you determine if you would like your child to attend their "home" School, check out www.greatschools.org.

From this website, you can input your address and see the schools closest to you by rating. The rating a school receives is the summary of the calculation of four ratings designed to show different areas of school success: student or academic progress, college readiness, equality and


test scores. Student progress measures whether students are improving over time on an individual level and academic progress measures whether the school is improving as a whole using school level data. College readiness measures how well high schools are preparing their students for success in college and careers. The rating is based on high school graduation rates, SAT and ACT performance and advanced course information. The Equity Rating is designed to measure how well a school serves the academic development of disadvantaged students and is measured by progress gaps between disadvantaged students and non-disadvantaged students, how disadvantaged students are performing based on student progress, academic progress and college and career readiness. The testing score measures academic proficiency using state test scores across grades and subjects. Together the ratings make up a score from 1-10 (1 being the lowest and 10 the highest).

Section 3: Enrollment


Now that you have decided which school you would like your child to attend, it is time to enroll them. First, go to https://jordandistrict.org/




Next, move your cursor over to where it says "Parents and Students"; this will bring down a drop down menu.




Click where it says "Registration & Enrollment".



From here you will be able to enroll online via Skyline Family Access. Enrollment starts mid-July. If this is the first time you are enrolling in the Jordan school district, click where it is highlighted in yellow.



It will bring up a page that will allow you to register for an account, so that you can enroll your student online.



After you have completed creating your account, navigate back to: https://planning.jordandistrict.org/enrollment/ and click where it is highlighted in Blue to login and continue the online enrollment process.



After you have completed the online portion make sure to contact your child's school to complete the enrollment process. If you do not have internet access at home, public libraries are a good resource to use. You can also visit the school you would like to enroll your child at; they may have a computer there that you are able to use.

Enrolling a returning student

If your student has already been enrolled in a school in the Jordan School District, you will not need to re-enroll unless the student has been expelled, graduated to the next level of school, or has moved out of the district. If this is the case, you will just need to re-enroll as if they were a new student following the process outlined above. (Pages 12-14).

Navigate to: https://planning.jordandistrict.org/enrollment/ and either create a new skyline account or login to your existing one (highlighted here in blue).



After you have logged in, you will be able to choose which school you would like to enroll your child in, based on your home school boundaries or if you were accepted for open enrollment at that school.

Open Enrollment:

If you want to enroll your student in a school whose boundaries you do not live in, you must file a request for a school choice permit online. If you do not have internet access at home, public libraries are an excellent resource to use. You can also fill out an application at the school of your choice.

An application for a permit is considered during three separate permit windows:

December 1st – December 31st is the early enrollment period, and gives you the highest chance of acceptance.

January 1st through the 3rd Friday in February – Permits are considered on a first come, first served bias.

After the 3rd Friday in February: Permits are considered based on the staff to student ratios.

Once an application has been accepted, you do not need to reapply each year. You will only need to reapply when your child has moved on from one level of schooling (i.e. from elementary school to middle school or from middle school to high school), your child is expelled or suspended, or the District determines that enrollment has exceeded the capacity of that school.

If you enroll at a school outside of your boundaries, you will be responsible for transporting your children to and from the school. **The school district does not provide bussing for students enrolled in school's outside of their boundaries.**

Section 4: Resources

<u>Immunization exemptions:</u> To receive a vaccination exemption form, the legally responsible individual who claims the exemption for the student must complete the online immunization education module. The education module can be accessed by going to:

https://immunize.utah.gov/immunization-education-module/. After the successful completion

of the module you will be emailed a vaccination exemption form that you need to fill out and turn into the school.

<u>Free and Reduced Lunch</u>: The Jordan school district accepts applications starting in July for the coming school year, but applications can be turned in at any point during the school year. Fill out one free and reduced price school meals application for all students in your household. Applications are available at the Jordan School District Office, at all schools, or online using your Skyward login.

You may turn in your application at the district office, mail it to Nutrition Services 7905 S. Redwood Road West Jordan UT 84088, fax it to 801-567-8768 or turn it in at any of your student's schools.

The Federal eligibility for Free and Reduced Meals changes each school year. Because of these annual changes, a new application must be submitted each year.

Transportation:

Your child will be eligible for bussing to school, if you live at least 2 miles away from your child's home middle school. If you opt to enroll your child in a different school then you are responsible for transporting your child to and from school.

If transportation is an issue, the UTA may have routes that will get your children closer to their school. You can buy monthly passes for children 6-17 (or those still attending high school) for reduced rates. The passes can be bought online at: https://www.rideuta.com/Fares-And-Passes/Buy-A-Pass. Look for the "Youth Monthly Pass" for local busses and TRAX access and the "Premium Youth Monthly Pass" if your children also need access to the FRONTRUNNER

USBE School Fees Parent FAQs

USBE R277-407 - School Fees

Pursuant to Utah Code 53G-6-702 through section 705 and Utah Admin. Code R277-494, students who attend a charter school, private school, or home school and participate in extracurricular and/or co-curricular activities are subject to the following:

Extracurricular/Co-Curricular Activities:

1. Charter and Online School Students

- a. Charter/Online school pays a one-time annual school participation fee of \$75.00 per student
- b. Student shall pay all required student activity specific fees
- c. Charter/Online school pays any waived fees
- 2. Private or Home School Students
- a. Student shall pay the basic registration fee and any required student activity specific fees.

Any mandatory payment for student participation in a class, program, or activity is a fee and is subject to the fee waiver requirements.

All fees listed are the maximum amounts charged per student for each class or school sponsored or supported activity. Actual amount charged may be less.

The proceeding table lists the maximum amounts that may be charged per pupil for each activity, class, or athletics participation. Actual fee amounts are determined by your school.

In addition to these district fees your child's middle school may have gotten additional fees approved by the school district.

These can be viewed online at: https://fees.jordandistrict.org/schedule/middle/. You can view the additional fees by clicking on your child's school name if it appears.

Fee waivers:

When enrolling at any school in the Jordan School District you are able to fill out the application for a fee waiver. The Jordan School District uses the state fee waiver form which is attached at the end of this packet. When you fill out the form, it will identify the documents that you will need to provide for verification. If your application is denied you are able to appeal the decision to the Jordan School District Administration, if it is denied again you can appeal to the Jordan School District Board of Education.

Special Education Services (Section 504 Plans and IEP's)

Section 504 is the part of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 which applies to persons with disabilities. Section 504 is a civil rights act protecting the civil and constitutional rights of persons with disabilities.

Section 504 states: "No otherwise qualified individual with a disability ... shall, solely by reason of her or his disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to any discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance."

If you believe your child is in need of specialized education services or other accommodations available to students with disabilities or difficulties in learning you can fill out a "referral for 504 assistance form" Which can be found online at: https://guidance.jordandistrict.org/wp-content/uploads/sites/20/054 504RehabActBook.pdf on page 22. This form must then be submitted to your child's principal.

A 504 plan documents the accommodations needing to be made, the persons responsible for providing them, the action to be taken with each accommodation, and the persons involved in developing the plan.

Students receiving help from a section 504 plan are re-evaluated once every three years or as often as circumstances require.

An IEP is an "Individualized Education Plan" It is a legal document that identifies the special education instruction, support and services to help your child succeed in school.

For Special Education Services you may ask any teacher, administrator or counselor to request special educational services or an evaluation. Once you have made the request, they will provide you with any paperwork and directions to continue the process.

Before School Programs:

Elk Ridge, Joel P. Jensen, Mountain Creek, Oquirrh Hills, South Hills, South Jordan, Sunset Ridge, West Hills, And West Jordan middle schools offer breakfast before class starts. If you do not see your school on this list, you can contact your school's main office with questions.

After school programs:

Most schools in the district have multiple after school opportunities be they athletic, artistic, or academic in nature. The best ways to find out about them are to check your school's website and to keep an eye out for information brought home by your children.

Appendix II: School Counselors, Social Workers and Psychologists

Each school in the Jordan school district has personnel specifically assigned to help you and your children establish healthy development and create positive boundaries around social, emotional and psychological health. These staff include social workers, school psychologists, speech language pathologists, and more.

Social workers and psychologists can provide counseling while providing social, emotional, and psychological support, they also help with IEP's and other accommodations, and can give referrals to outside resources.

Speech language pathologists help students with communication delays. They can help your children with literacy, fluency, articulation, and social communication issues.

Guidance Counselors help with academic and behavioral challenges.

In addition to these personnel the Jordan School District has a website devoted to positive mental and emotional health: https://wellness.jordandistrict.org/ and the Jordan Family Education Center provides classes, support groups and short term counseling at no charge to families living within the district boundaries. Short term counseling requires an intake appointment which can be set up by calling 801-565-7442. Counseling sessions are typically held on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday evenings. All other questions concerning classes or hours can be directed to 801-565-7442
